STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT for the better protection of Game.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person who is a lawful citizen of
2 the Dominion of Canada, not having his domicile
3 in the United States shall hunt, take, kill, wound
4 or destroy any moose, deer or caribou, or any game
5 birds or fur bearing animals such as mink, otter,
6 fisher, sable, or beaver, without first having obtained
7 a license as provided in section two under a penalty
8 of fifty dollars for each offence to be recovered by
9 indictment, one-half to the use of the prosecutor,
10 and one-half to the county.

SECT. 2. Said licenses may be granted by the
2 commissioners of fish and game on payment of a

3 fee of twenty dollars, and be in force until the first
4 day of January next following the date of such
5 license. All such fees shall be expended by said
6 commissioners in enforcing the laws of the State
7 for the protection of moose, deer and caribou.
