

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Lydia R. Hayden.

Resolved, That there be paid to Lydia R. Hayden, 2 minor, child of Granville A. Hayden, an annuity

- 3 of one hundred dollars per annum, payable
- 4 quarterly, to be paid from June 30th next until
- 5 she is twenty-one years of age, unless married
- 6 before that time, and the governor and council are
- 7 hereby authorized to draw their warrant on the
- 8 treasurer therefor, payable to the lawful guardian
- 9 of the said Lydia R. Hayden.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Granville A. Hayden, about fifteen years since residing at Presque Isle, Aroostook, Maine, was a deputy sheriff of that county. While in the discharge of his duty as deputy sheriff, in arresting a desperate fellow for crime he was foully murdered and his body burned. He died, leaving a sickly wife and two minor children, one a boy, the other a girl. The State, in 1874 I think, granted them an annuity of one hundred dollars each till they should arrive at the age of sixteen years. The boy is past that age, the girl is sixteen in June next. Her mother has since died, leaving the feeble daughter an orphan, unable to support herself. This is her situation and the continuance of one hundred dollars annuity is asked till she becomes twenty-one, unless sooner married.
