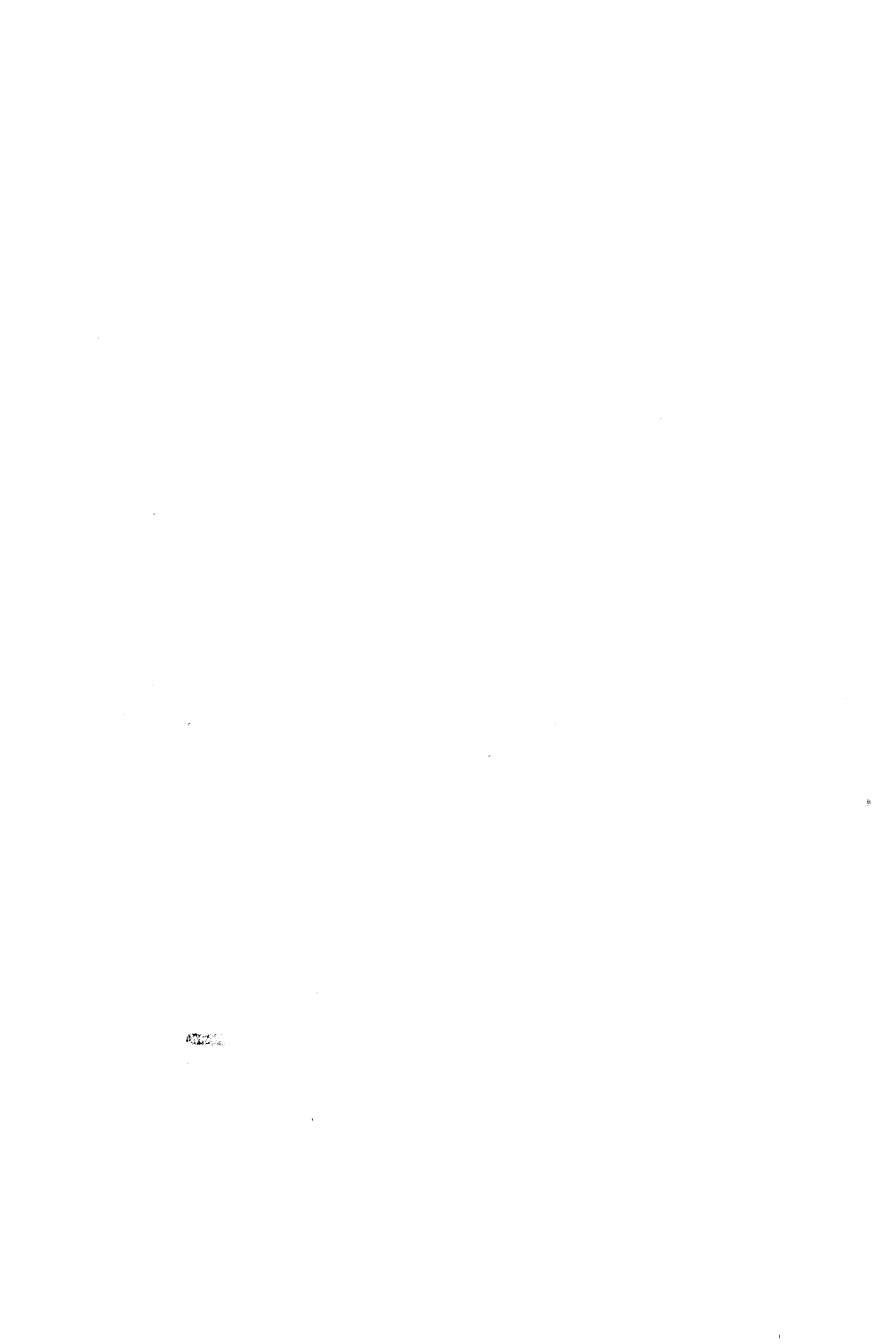

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Frank Hamilton of Springvale.

Resolved, That there be paid to Frank Hamilton
2 of Springvale the sum of six dollars per month as
3 a military pension, commencing on the first day of
4 January, in the year of our Lord one thousand
5 eight hundred and eighty-nine.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Frank Hamilton, of Springvale, was discharged from the army in 1863 for disability. He was a member of the 7th New Hampshire Volunteers, but has been a resident of the State since 1864. His health was ruined in the service, and he has not been able to do half a man's work, and now is unable to labor at all. His wife is a feeble woman, and they are in extremely destitute circumstances, with no means of support.
