## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section forty-two of chapter one hundred and twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, relating to Cruelty to Animals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section forty-two of chapter one
- 2 hundred and twenty-four of the Revised Statutes
- 3 is hereby amended, so that the same shall read as
- 4 follows:
  - 'SECT. 42. Such officer or agent may take pos-
- 6 session of any old, maimed, disabled, diseased or
- 7 injured animal not properly cared for and apply to
- 8 any municipal or police court or trial justice for
- 9 process to cause the same to be destroyed. If the

owner is known, a copy of such application shall to served upon him in hand with an order of court to appear at a time and place named to show cause why such animal should not be destroyed and its value fixed. If the owner is not known, then the court shall order notices to be posted in two public and conspicuous places in the town, stating the case in substance, and giving forty-eight hours' notice of the hearing thereon. At such hearings the court shall determine the value of such animal and may issue process directing such officer to destroy the same. The defendant may appeal as in 22 civil actions.'
