STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section one hundred and twelve
of chapter forty-seven of the Revised Statutes, relat-
ing to Bank Deposit Books.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. That section one hundred and twelve
2 of chapter forty-seven, Revised Statutes, be amended
3 by inserting after the word "issued," in the first line
4 thereof, the words "or his executor, or administrator,
5 or guardian," so that said section, when amended,
6 shall read as follows:

'SECT. 112. When the person, to whom a book
8 of deposit was issued, or his executor, or adminis-

9 trator or guardian, in writing notifies the treasurer
10 of the bank issuing the same, that such book is
11 lost, and that he desires to have a duplicate book
12 of deposit issued to him, said treasurer shall give
13 public notice of such application by publishing at
14 the expense of such applicant, an advertisement
15 for three weeks successively, in some newspaper
16 published in the town in which said bank is located,
17 if any, otherwise in one published in the county, if
18 any, and, if not, then in the State paper. If such
19 missing deposit book is not presented to said treas-
20 urer within six months after the last advertisement,
21 then he shall issue a duplicate book of deposit to
22 the person thus requesting the same, and such
23 delivery of a duplicate relieves said bank from all
24 liability on account of the original book of deposit
25 so advertised.'
