## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter twenty-four, section fortynine, Revised Statutes, referring to bringing Paupers into any Town.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section forty-nine of chapter twenty-
- 2 four of the Revised Statutes relating to penalty for
- 3 bringing paupers into a town is hereby amended so
- 4 that it shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 49. Whoever brings into and leaves in a
- 6 town where he has no settlement, any poor, indigent
- 7 or insane person, having no visible means of sup-
- 8 port, or hires or procures such person to be so
- 9 brought, or aids or abets in so doing, knowing

10 such person to be poor, indigent or insane as afore11 said, with intent to charge such town or the State
12 with the support of such person, shall be fined not
13 exceeding three hundred dollars, or imprisoned not
14 exceeding one year, and shall be further liable to
15 any town or to the State for such sums of money
16 as are expended by such town or by the State for
17 the support and maintenance of such person which
18 may be recovered in an action of the case.
