STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section five of chapter one hundred
and eleven of the Revised Statutes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section five of chapter one hundred
2 and eleven of the Revised Statutes, is hereby
3 amended by striking out the words "in a note for
4 more than thirty dollars," in the fifth line of said
5 section, so that said section, as amended, shall
6 read as follows:

'Section 5. No agreement that personal property
8 bargained and delivered to another, for which a
9 note is given, shall remain the property of the

10 payee until the note is paid, is valid, unless it is
11 made and signed as a part of the note; and no
12 such agreement, although so made and signed, is
13 valid, except as between the original parties to
14 said agreement, unless it is recorded like mortgages
15 of personal property; and on receipt of twenty-five
16 cents, each town clerk shall record such notes in a
17 book kept for that purpose.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when
2 approved.
