STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making an appropriation for the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the State 2 treasury to the agent of the Penobscot Indians to 3 be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe each year 4 as follows: Forty-four hundred and twenty-nine 5 dollars and seventy cents, amount of interest on 6 their trust fund held by the State for the benefit 7 of said tribe; seventeen hundred dollars for their 8 annual annuity each year; seven hundred dollars 9 for agricultural purposes each year; three hundred 10 dollars for bounty on crops each year; two hun-11 dred dollars for salary of Indian Agent each year; 12 one hundred and fifty dollars to pay a competent 13 person to instruct and assist said Indians in their

14 agricultural labors each year; six hundred dollars 15 for schools each year, to be used in employing 16 competent teachers, namely: Four hundred dollars 17 for Old Town island under the supervision of the 18 agent of said tribe and resident priest; seventy-19 five dollars for Olamon island under the supervision 20 of the superintending school committee of Green-21 bush; one hundred and twenty-five on Mattanaw-22 cook island under the supervision of the superin-23 tending school committee of Lincoln; and said 24 committee are required to report as directed in 25 Resolve, approved March seventeen, eighteen hun-26 dred and sixty; and it shall be the duty of said 27 agent to see that the money is fully expended for 28 the education of the children of the tribe; one 29 hundred dollars for the salary of said priest each 30 year, provided he says mass at least twenty-four 31 Sundays during the year for said tribe of Indians; 32 fifty dollars for the salary of Governor each year; 33 forty dollars for salary of their Lieutenant-Gov-34 ernor each year; two hundred dollars to repair 35 school-house. All the foregoing sums to be paid 36 under the direction of the Governor and Council.
