## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT amendatory of section thirty of chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes relating to Liens on Buildings and Lots.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty of chapter ninety-one

- 2 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
- 3 inserting after the word "altering" in the second
- 4 line the word 'moving' and after the word
- 5 "erected" in the ninth line the words 'or to which
- 6 it is moved' so that said section, as amended, shall
- 7 read as follows, viz.:

'Section 30. Whoever performs labor, or fur-9 nishes labor or materials in erecting, altering, mov-10 ing, or repairing a house, building or appurtenances, 11 by virtue of a contract with or by consent of the 12 owner, has a lien thereon, and on the land on 13 which it stands, and on any interest that such 14 owner has in the same, to secure payment thereof 15 with costs, to be enforced by attachment; and if a 16 levy is made thereon, the appraiser may set out 17 a suitable lot for said building, if they think that 18 the whole is not needed therefor. If the debtor 19 has no legal interest in the land on which the 20 building is erected, or to which it is moved, the 21 lien attaches to the building and may be enforced 22 as before provided; and if the owner of such land 23 or building, so contracting, is a minor or married 24 woman, such lien shall exist, and such minority or 25 coverture shall not bar a recovery in any suit 26 brought to enforce it.'
