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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-ONE.

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AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter two  
hundred of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred  
and eighty-nine.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter 200 of the  
2 Public Laws of 1889 is hereby amended by insert-  
3 ing after the word "inn" in the first line the words  
4 'or goes into any saloon, restaurant or victualling  
5 place;' and after the word "inn" in the fourth line  
6 the words 'saloon, restaurant or victualling place;'  
7 and after the word "inn" in the sixth line the

8 words 'saloon, restaurant or victualling place,' so  
9 that said section as amended shall read as follows,  
10 namely:

'Section 1. Whoever puts up at an inn, or goes  
12 into any saloon, restaurant or victualling place,  
13 and without having an express agreement for  
14 credit, procure food, entertainment or accommoda-  
15 tion without paying therefor, and with intent to  
16 defraud the owner or keeper of the inn, saloon,  
17 restaurant or victualling place out of the pay for  
18 the same; or, with intent to cheat or defraud such  
19 owner or keeper out of the pay therefor, obtain  
20 credit at an inn, saloon, restaurant or victualling  
21 place for such food, entertainment or accommoda-  
22 tion by means of any false show of baggage or  
23 effects brought thereto; or with such intent remove  
24 or cause to be removed any baggage or effects  
25 from an inn or boarding house, while there is a  
26 lien existing thereon for the proper charges due  
27 from him for fare and board furnished therein,  
28 shall be punished by imprisonment not exceeding  
29 three months, or by fine not exceeding fifty dollars.
