RESOLVE in favor of Swanville.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of

- 2 State out of the school funds of the current year,
- 3 to the town of Swanville the sum of twenty-nine
- 4 and eighty-nine one hundredths dollars (\$29.89), it
- 5 being a balance equitably due said town as its pro-
- 6 portion of the school funds for the year eighteen
- 7 hundred and ninety.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The total amount equitably due the town of Swanville from the school funds of the State for the year 1890 was \$401.70. Total number of scholars, 215. The amount drawn for the year 1890 was \$371.81 or on 199 scholars, leaving a balance due the town of \$29.89.

There being a division of the board of S. S. committee, the chairman of the committee was unable to procure all the registers in season to report to the State Superintendent of Schools as required by law, consequently the apportionment was reckoned on a basis of 199 instead of 215 scholars.
