STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to repeal section thirty of chapter one hundred and twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, relating to the keeping or using of live pigeons, fowl or other bird for a target, or to be shot at for amusement, or as a test of skill in marksmanship.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirty of chapter one hundred and twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, which reads as follows, viz.: "Whoever keeps or uses any live pigeon, fowl or other bird for a

5 target, or to be shot at either for amusement or as
6 a test of skill in marksmanship, and whoever
7 shoots at any bird as aforesaid, or is present as a
8 party, umpire or judge at such shooting, and who-
9 ever rents any building, shed, room, yard, field or
10 premises, or knowingly suffers the use of the same
11 for such purpose, shall be punished by imprison-
12 ment in jail not exceeding thirty days, or by fine
13 not exceeding fifty dollars, or both. Nothing in
14 this section prohibits the shooting of wild game in
15 its wild state," is hereby repealed.
