STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Ellen Regan of Lewiston.

Resolved, That there be paid to Ellen Regan of
2 Lewiston, out of the State treasury, a pension of ten
3 dollars per month, commencing on the first day of
4 January eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Miss Regan is the daughter of John O. Regan of Co. C, 6th Maine, also Co. C, 1st Maine Veteran Volunteers, who died of wounds December 10, 1864, at Philadelphia. Miss Regan has been a paralytic from childhood being entirely helpless. She is dependent on a sister who has no means, and has also a brother who is totally blind, for the past six or eight years. Their mother received United States pension and also State aid which is now cut off owing to the mother's death on November 29, 1890.
