STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter three hundred and fourteen of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, relating to the citizenship of persons connected with the Soldiers' Home at Togus.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. That section one of chapter three 2 hundred and fourteen, Public Laws of eighteen 3 hundred and eighty-five, be amended by inserting 4 after the words "shall continue therewith" in the 5 last line thereof, the following: 'but any person

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6 connected with the National Home as aforesaid, 7 but having a domicile in a town, in this State, out-8 side of said Home and a voting residence therein, 9 shall not be disqualified from voting in the town 10 in which he has such residence on account of his 11 connection with said Home,' so that said section 12 when amended will read as follows:

'Section 1. All persons who now are, or may 14 hereafter become inmates of the National Home for 15 disabled volunteer soldiers at Togus, in the county 16 of Kennebec, or subject to the rules and regula-17 tions thereof, or shall receive rations therefrom, 18 shall be deemed citizens of the respective towns in 19 which they had a legal residence when their connec-20 tion with said National Home commenced so long 21 as such connection shall continue therewith, but 22 any person connected with the national home as 23 aforesaid, but having a domicile in a town in this 24 State, outside of said Home and a voting residence 25 therein, shall not be disqualified from voting in the 26 town in which he has such residence, on account 27 of his connection with said home.'
