STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section eighty-seven of chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes, relating to the qualifications of instructors in public schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 87 of chapter 11 of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting 3 in specification two thereof, after the word “physi- 4 ology,” the words, ‘and the elements of the natural 5 sciences, especially as applied to agriculture,’ so 6 that said specification will read as follows:

‘On satisfactory evidence that a candidate pos- 8 sesses a good moral character, and a temper and

9 disposition suitable to be an instructor of youth,
10 they shall examine him in reading, spelling, Eng-
11 lish grammar, geography, history, arithmetic, book-
12 keeping and physiology, and the elements of the
13 natural sciences, especially as applied to agricul-
14 ture, and such other branches as they desire to
15 introduce into public schools, and particularly into
16 the school for which he is examined; also as to his
17 capacity for the government thereof.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on and after
2 August 1, 1891.
