IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the City of Auburn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The charter of the city of Auburn

- 2 is hereby amended by adding to the fourth section
- 3 thereof, the following words: 'And it shall be the
- 4 duty of the city council at least once in ten years,
- 5 and not oftener than once in five years, to review,
- 6 and if necessary to alter said wards, and the
- 7 boundaries thereof, in such manner as to preserve,

8 as nearly as may be, an equal number of inhabit-

9 ants in each wards,' so that said section when

10 amended shall read as follows:

'Section 4. The selectmen of the town 12 Auburn, as soon as may be after this act shall 13 have been accepted as hereinafter provided, shall 14 cause a division of said town to be made into five 15 wards, in such manner as to include as nearly as 16 conveniently may be consistently with well defined 17 ward limits, an equal number of inhabitants in 18 each ward, and appoint a warden to preside at the 19 first meeting until a warden is elected. And it 20 shall be the duty of the city council at least once 21 in ten years, and not oftener than once in five 22 years, to review, and if necessary to alter said 23 wards, and the boundaries thereof, in such manner 24 as to preserve, as nearly as may be, an equal num-25 ber of inhabitants in each ward,

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
