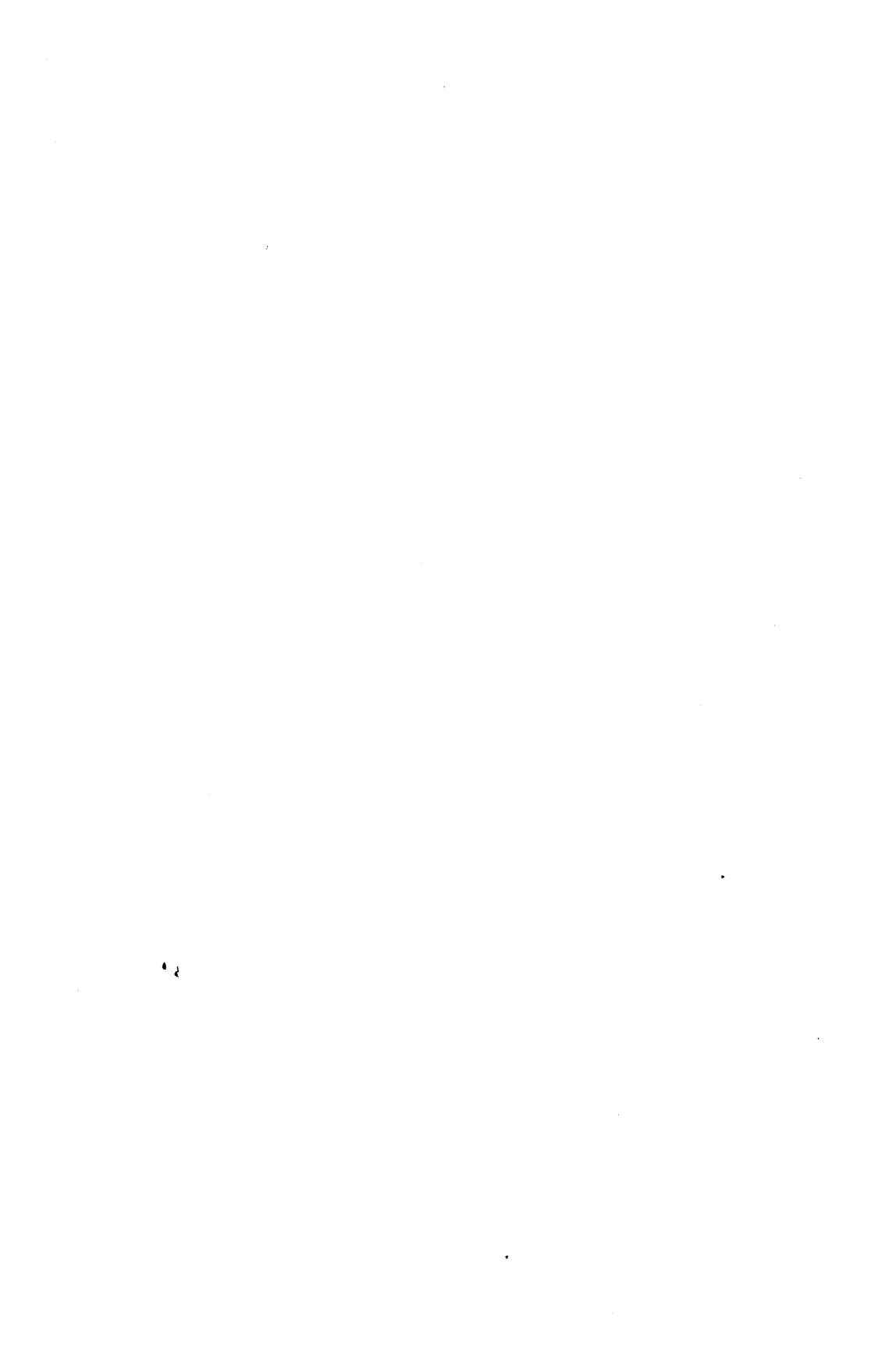

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of an appropriation for repair of
Trout Brook Road.

Resolved, That the sum of nine hundred dollars
2 be and hereby is appropriated for repair of the
3 Trout Brook road (so called) between Patten in
4 Penobscot county and Trout Brook in Piscataquis
5 county, and that said appropriation shall be ex-
6 pended under the supervision of the land agent.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This is a road leading from Patten in Penobscot county to a place called Trout Brook in Piscataquis county, and is a very *important* road, is used largely for the transportation of supplies from said Patten to said Trout Brook, and that large quantities of freights are carried annually over said road, that said road is used largely by tourists and others as the *direct* route to northern Maine pleasure resorts. That said road is the means of access to large lumber operations in said northern section of the State, that a portion of said road, viz., from Shin Pond to said Trout Brook is almost impassable at times of the year and very bad at all times, that the condition of said portion of the road greatly hinders and obstructs public travel and is detrimental to the business interests of a large section of the State and retards its development.

There are some farms on said road and as the lands are good for settling others would soon settle if a suitable road could be obtained.
