STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE for the payment of back salaries of Guards at the State Prison.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and sixty-

- 2 five dollars and thirty-two cents (\$165.32) be and
- 3 is hereby appropriated to pay the deficiency of sal-
- 4 aries of two guards at the State prison, in the fol-
- 5 lowing proportions, and to the following named
- 6 persons: To Benjamin W. White, eighty-five dol-
- 7 lars and thirty-two cents (\$85.32), and to F. L.
- 8 Robinson, eighty dollars (\$80).



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Benjamin W. White served as guard at the State prison in 1880 and 1881 for twelve months and twenty-six days. He was paid but \$420 a year. The salary as fixed by law was \$500 a year. (See Resolves of 1876, Chapter 196; Revised Statutes 1883, chapter 115, section 1, page 861). By chapter 110, resolves of 1887, and chapter 181, resolves of 1889, the amounts due nineteen guards have been paid, and their salaries adjusted on the basis fixed by law. The back salary due White should be adjusted on the same basis and for the same reasons. His claim was inadvertently omitted in 1889.
