RESOLVE in favor of Madawaska Training School.

---

*Resolved,* That the sum of five thousand (\$5000)  
2 dollars be appropriated from the State treasury for  
3 enlarging the school building of the Madawaska  
4 Training School at Fort Kent, and for the erection  
5 of a boarding-house for the better accommodation  
6 of studends attending said school, the same to be  
7 expended under the direction of the board of trus-  
8 tees of State Normal Schools.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In accordance with an act of the legislature of 1887, Madawaska Training School was permanently located at Fort Kent, and a building was erected for its accommodation. Since such location, the attendance upon the school has so largely increased that the building is already over-crowded. In its construction it was so planned that it can be readily and cheaply enlarged. Such enlargement is an immediate necessity. When the school was located as above the facilities for boarding seemed ample. Within the last year, however, many students have been unable to obtain boarding places and have therefore been unable to attend. Owing to the opening of a railroad to the town and the conditions consequent thereon, the present lack of facilities is almost certain to become greater. In order that the school may do the work for which it was established there is imperative need that adequate facilities for board of students shall in some way be made secure.

This can only be done by establishing a boarding-house under control of those having charge of the school.

For the purposes stated above the sum provided for in this resolve is needed.
