RESOLVE in aid of the Maine Gettysburg Commission.

Resolved, That the sum of five thousand dollars

- 2 be and is hereby appropriated to be expended in
- 3 completing the work of the Maine Gettysburg
- 4 Commission; said sum to be expended by the
- 5 Executive Committee of said Commission, with the
- 6 approval of the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Chairman and Secretary of the Executive Committee of the Maine Gettysburg Commission, through whom the work of the Commission has been accomplished in the main, state now as the reasons for an additional appropriation the following facts, viz.: Sixteen hundred ten and fifty-four one-hundredths dollars (\$1610.54) of the last appropriation was returned into the treasury at the close of the year 1890, by the order of the Governor and Council, who were not informed that the money was needed and, in fact, had been appropriated to be used in payment of the bills of the committee contracted in the construction, erection and needed alterations of the monuments, markers, tablets, inscriptions and projected change of location of one monument.

The Executive Committee have in preparation, and under a good degree of forwardness, a suitable report of the proceedings of the Commission, including the ceremonies of the dedication of the monument at Gettysburg, October 10, 1889, historical sketches, &c., &c., and other matters of general interest, all intended to place in a permanent historical form, the part taken by Maine troops in the eventful campaign of Gettysburg. To accomplish and finish all the work of the Commission and bring their duties to a conclusion, comporting with the duty and dignity of the State, the sum called for by the foregoing resolve will be required. We herewith submit a statement of our receipts and expenditures.
