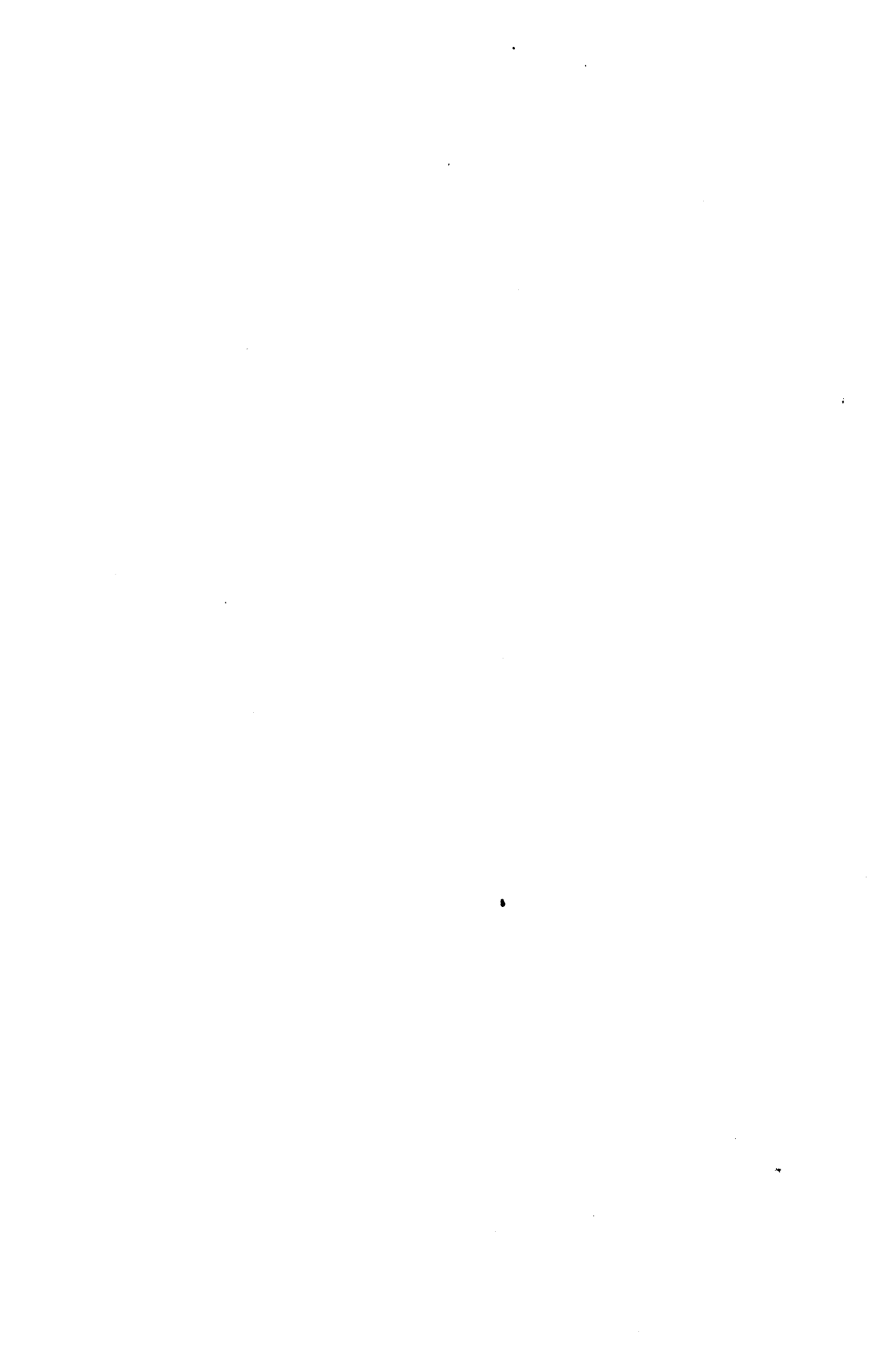
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED

AN ACT to amend Section Twenty-five, Chapter
Forty-one, of the Revised Statutes, relating to Sur-
veyors of logs.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section twenty-five, chapter forty-one, of the Re-
2 vised Statutes, is hereby amended by adding
3 thereto the following words: 'All logs shall be
4 surveyed and scaled according to the "Bangor Log
5 Rule,"' so that said section as amended shall read:

‘Section 25. Surveyors of logs may inspect, survey and measure all mill logs floated or brought to market, or offered for sale in their towns, and divide them into several classes, corresponding to the different qualities of boards and other sawed lumber which may be manufactured from them; and they shall give certificates under their hands of the quantity and quality thereof, to the person at whose request they are surveyed. All logs shall be surveyed and scaled according to the “Bangor Log Rule.”’
