STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section forty of chapter forty of
the Revised Statutes, relating to the appointment
of Wardens.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section forty of chapter forty of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting in
3 the first line of said section after the word "council"
4 the following words: 'upon the written request of
5 at least a majority of the three commissioners

6 appointed under section thirty-three of this chap-
7 ter,' so that said section as amended shall read as
8 follows:

'Section 40. The governor, with advice and con-
10 sent of council, upon the written request of at least
11 a majority of the three commissioners appointed
12 under section thirty-three of this chapter, may
13 appoint wardens, who shall enforce all laws relat-
14 ing to game and the fisheries, arrest all violators
15 thereof, and prosecute all offences against the
16 same; they shall have the same power to serve
17 criminal processes against such offenders, and shall
18 be allowed the same fees as sheriffs for like ser-
19 vices; they shall have the same right as sheriff
20 and their deputies to require aid in executing the
21 duties of their office; and whoever refuses or neg-
22 lects to render such aid when required, forfeits ten
23 dollars, to be recovered upon complaint. Fish
24 wardens shall hold office for three years unless
25 sooner removed.'
