### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section forty-six of chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, to provide for the better Protection of Smelts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section forty-six of chapter forty of 2 the Revised Statutes as amended by section one of 3 chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the public 4 laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven is 5 hereby amended by striking out the words "and 6 twenty-tifth day of April," in the twentieth line 7 and inserting instead thereof, the words 'first day 8 of April and the first day of May, and all smelts 9 caught by dip nets, between said days, may be 10 lawfully offered for sale and sold in this State,' 11 and also by adding to said section the words, 'nor 12 to smelts taken in Casco bay between the fifteenth 13 day of September and the first day of Oetober,' so 14 that said section, as amended, shall read as fol- 15 lows:

'Section 46. No smelts shall be taken or fished 17 for in tidal waters, except by hook and line, 18 between the first days of April and October, under 19 a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty 20 dollars for each offence, and a further penalty of 21 twenty cents for each smelt so taken, and all 22 weirs for the capture of smelts shall be opened 23 and so remain, and all nets used in the smelt and 24 tom-cod fishery shall be taken from the water on 25 or before said first day of April, under a penalty 26 of not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars, 27 and a further fine of five dollars for each day that 28 any such weir or net remains in violation of law, 29 but weirs with catch pounds covered with net, the 30 meshes of which are one inch square in the clear,

31 or greater, are not subject to this section. 32 no smelts caught in such weirs after the first day of 33 April shall be sold or offered for sale in this State. 34 nor shall smelts caught in any manner between the 35 first day of April and the first day of October fol-36 lowing be offered for sale, sold, or shipped from 37 the State under a penalty of twenty-five dollars 38 for each offence; provided, however, that dip nets 39 may be used between the first day of April and 40 the first day of May, and all smelts caught by dip 41 nets between said days may be lawfully offered for 42 sale and sold in this State; provided, further, that 43 this section does not apply to smelts taken in the 44 Androscoggin river above the Merrymeeting bay 45 bridge between the first days of October and 46 November, nor to smelts taken in the Penobscot 47 river and its tributaries between the first and 48 fifteenth days of April, nor to smelts taken in 49 Casco bay between the fifteenth day of September 50 and the first day of October.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
