STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to amend Chapter Forty-five of the
Resolves of 1857, entitled "Resolve in favor of
Constant A. McLaughlin."

Resolved, That chapter forty-five of the resolves
2 of 1857 be and hereby is amended by striking out
3 the word "said," in the eighth line thereof, and
4 inserting instead thereof the word 'the'; also strik-
5 ing out the words "seventy-five," in the eighth line
6 thereof, and inserting instead thereof the words
7 'one hundred'; also adding after the word "Mc-
8 Laughlin" in the ninth line thereof, the words 'in

9 two semi-annual payments of fifty dollars each';
10 also by striking out the words "annually there-
11 after" in the tenth line thereof, and inserting
12 instead thereof the words 'and the sixth day of
13 November annually hereafter'; also striking out
14 all of said chapter after the word "labor" at the
15 end of the eleventh line thereof, so that said chap-
16 ter as amended shall read as follows:

'*Resolved*, That there be paid out of any money
18 in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to
19 Constant A. McLaughlin, the sum of seventy-five
20 dollars, as a compensation for injuries to his left
21 shoulder, received in aiding an officer of the peace
22 at Lewiston, on the sixth day of May, eighteen
23 hundred and fifty-four, in capturing one Thomas
24 Hyde, there engaged in a breach of the peace, said
25 sum to be in full for said injuries to the sixth day
26 of May, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven. And
27 that the sum of one hundred dollars be paid to said
28 Constant A. McLaughlin, in two semi-annual pay-
29 ments of fifty dollars each, on the sixth day of May
30 and the sixth day of November annually hereafter,
31 as a compensation for said injuries, so long as they
31 incapacitate him from obtaining a subsistence by
32 manual labor.'
