STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section fifteen of chapter forty-one of the Public Laws in relation to the surveying of lumber.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 41, section 15, is hereby amended 2 so as to read as follows:

'Section 15. All boards, plank, timber and joist, offered 4 for sale shall, before delivery, be surveyed by a sworn 5 surveyor thereof, if requested by either the buyer or 6 seller, and if he has doubts of the dimensions thereof, he 7 shall measure the same, and mark the contents thereon,

8 making reasonable allowance for rots, knots and splits, 9 drying and shrinking; pine boards three-fourths of an 10 inch thick when fully seasoned, and in that proportion 11 when partly seasoned, shall be considered merchantable; 12 and no pine boards, except sheathing boards, shall be 13 shipped for exportation beyond the United States, but 14 such as are square-edged, and not less than seven-eights 15 of an inch thick, nor less than ten feet long, under penalty 16 of forfeiture to the town whence shipped. Nothing in 17 this section shall prevent the recovery of money due for 18 such lumber sold and delivered when the same has been 19 surveyed at the mill where manufactured by any compe-20 tent surveyor.'

SECT. 2. Chapter 41, section 21, is hereby repealed.
