STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Jonas Greene.

Resolved, That there be paid to Jonas Greene of 2 Bluehill, out of the State Treasury, a pension of 3 four dollars per month, commencing on the first day 4 of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

APPLICATION FOR STATE PENSION.

In case of Jonas Greene of Bluehill in the county of Hancock and State of Maine, aged 73 years, of the identical Jonas Greene who served in the army of the United States, in the war of 1839, Aroostook War, on the quota of Maine, viz. : Company ——, Capt. Isaac Greene, of the

regiment of Maine Volunteers, and was disabled in said service, and in line of duty as follows, viz.: lameness, caused by a continuous march from Surry to Cherryfield, and got but one meal during the time; was laid up nearly two years.

The above-named applicant is the owner of a small house of the value of \$50; does not own any land, is now supported by the *town* of *Bluehill*; is not able to do much labor; his trouble is in his legs, "large varicose veins are ruptured." We have known Mr. Green since we were large enough to know anybody, and certify that he has always been a hardworking, industrious, temperate man, and was at one time the owner of a good farm, but fire and other losses has exhausted all.

We further represent that, to the best of our knowledge and belief founded on a careful and personal examination, the disability and necessity for aid from the State continue, and all the resources of said applicant are insufficient for his support, and that he will be compelled to resort to public or private charity if the State pension is not allowed.
