RESOLVE, in favor of Emil S. Winberg.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby author-2 is d to convey to Emil S. Winberg, lot number 3 eighteen and a half (181-2) in Woodland, Aroos-4 took county, waiving further settling duties.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Under the law for the establishment of the Swedish colony the lot of land described in the foregoing resolve was assigned to Emil S. Winberg, it being considered a lot fit for a farm. In truth and in fact the lot is not fit for settlement and can not make a home for said Winberg or any one else. It is a swamp lot much burnt. Although said Winberg was granted a certificate of said lot he has been unable to protect it, and it has been pillaged for years and the timber removed in defiance of his rights. His title is superior to that of any one else and he prays that the lot may be conveyed to him, waiving further settling duties.
