STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 379 of the Public Laws of 1885, entitled "An Act to prevent incompetent persons from conducting the business of apothecaries."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section four of said chapter is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting after the word "apothecary", in the second
- 3 line thereof, the words, 'in the State of Maine', so that
- 4 said section as amended shall read as follows:
- 'Section 4. Every person not now registered, unless he
- 6 was engaged in the business of apothecary, in the State
- 7 of Maine, on the eleventh day of March, in the year
- 8 of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, contin-
- 9 uing in or hereafter entering on the business of an apoth-

- 10 ecary, shall be examined by said commissioners, and shall
- 11 present to them satisfactory evidence that he has been an
- 12 apprentice, or employed in an apothecary store where phy-
- 13 sicians' prescriptions are compounded, at least three years;
- 14 or has graduated from some regularly incorporated med-
- 15 ical college or college of pharmacy, and is competent for
- 16 the business; and the commissioners may then grant
- 17 him a certificate and registry as hereinbefore provided;
- 18 but only one of the partners in a firm need be a registered
- 19 druggist, provided, the partner who compounds medicines
- 20 be registered. And any physician who has a diploma as
- 21 a graduate of a duly established medical college, and in
- 22 active practice, may do the business of an apothecary with-
- 23 out being registered.'
 - SECT. 2. Section seven of said chapter is hereby
 - 2 amended by striking out all after the word "owners" in
 - 3 the sixth line thereof, so that said section as amended
 - 4 shall read as follows:
 - 'Section 7. It shall not be lawful for any apothecary store
 - 6 to be kept open for the sale of medicines or poisons, or
 - 7 for compounding physicians' prescriptions, unless the
 - 8 same is placed and kept under the personal control and
- 9 supervision of a registered apothecary or qualified assist-
- 10 ant who is satisfactory to the owners.'
 - SECT. 3. Section eight of said chapter is hereby amended
 - 2 by inserting after the word "apothecary" in the second
- .3 line thereof, the words 'in the State of Maine,' so that
- 4 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:
 - 'Section 8. Any person engaged in the business of
- 6 apothecary, in the State of Maine, on the eleventh day of
- 7 March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-

- 8 dred and seventy-seven, may receive a certificate and be
- 9 registered as aforesaid on application to said commissioners,
- 10 with proof of his competency.'
 - SECT. 4. Section nine of said chapter is hereby amended
 - 2 by inserting after the word "apothecary" in the second line
 - 3 thereof, the words 'in the State of Maine,' and by striking
 - 4 out all after the word "act" in the fifth line thereof, and
 - 5 inserting in the place thereof the following, 'he shall upon
 - 6 indictment and conviction be subject to a penalty of fifty
 - 7 dollars per month for the first offence, and of one hundred
 - 8 dollars per month for each and every subsequent offence,
 - 9 whether of continuance in said business or for engaging
- 10 anew therein in violation of the provisions of this act. It
- 11 is hereby made the duty of the county attorney in each
- 12 county, upon complaint made by any one of said commis-
- 13 sioners, to prosecute all violations of the provisions of this
- 14 act. The treasurer of each county shall pay to the treas-
- 15 urer of the law library association of his county for the
- 16 use and benefit of the county law library twenty per cent
- 17 of all fines actually paid into the county treasury for the
- 18 violation of any of the provisions of this act,' so that said
- 19 section as amended shall read as follows:
- 'Section 9. If any person who was not engaged in the
- 21 business of an apothecary within the State of Maine on
- 22 the eleventh day of March, in the year of our Lord one
- 23 thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, shall here-
- 24 after engage in or carry on the business of an apothecary
- 25 contrary to the provisions of this act, he shall upon indict-
- 26 ment and conviction be subject to a penalty of fifty dollars
- 27 per month for the first offence, and of one hundred dollars
- 28 per month for each and every subsequent offense whether

29 of continuance in said business or for engaging anew 30 therein in violation of the provisions of this act. It is 31 hereby made the duty of the county attorney in each 32 county, upon complaint made by any one of said commis-33 sioners, to prosecute all violations of the provisions of 34 this act. The treasurer of each county shall pay to the 35 treasurer of the law library association of his county for 36 the use and benefit of the county law library, twenty per 37 cent of all fines actually paid into the county treasury for 38 the violation of any of the provisions of this act.'
