STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to chapter two hundred and twenty-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty, relating to the Militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirty-three of chapter two hundred and twenty-five of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty is hereby amended so as to read as follows: 'The staff of the Commander-in-Chief shall consist of the Adjutant General, who shall be *ex-officio*, Chief of Staff, Quartermaster General, and Paymaster General, with the rank of brigadier general; an Inspector General, with the rank of brigadier general; a Commissary General, a Surgeon

9 General, and a Judge Advocate General each with the
10 rank of Colonel; four Aides-de-Camp, with the rank of
11 lieutenant colonel, and a Military Secretary with the rank
12 of major. All staff officers of the Commander-in-Chief,
13 except the Adjutant General, shall be appointed and com-
14 missioned by him, and shall hold office during the term
15 of office of the Governor, unless sooner removed by him,
16 which he may do at his pleasure. *Provided, however,*
17 *that in case of war or invasion, the Commander in-Chief*
18 *may appoint such additional staff officers as the public*
19 *service may require, and with such rank as he may desig-*
20 *nate.'*

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to officers now holding
2 positions on the Staff of the Commander-in-Chief.
