RESOLVE making an appropriation for the examination of Pension Claims.

---

*Resolved,* That the State Pension Agent is hereby authorized to expend such sum under the direction of the Governor and Council, not exceeding two hundred dollars, as may be necessary to properly examine the claims presented to his office, the same to be paid out of the appropriation for soldiers' pensions for the years 1891 and 1892.



The sum proposed to be expended by this resolve is to be used to defray the actual expenses of travel and subsistence of the pension agent in going to different parts of the State to examine into the merit of the claims presented to his office and does in no way increase his salary.
