STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and five of
the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred
and eighty-seven of the State of Maine entitled an
act in relation to the Police Court of the City of
Bangor.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section four of chapter two hun-
2 dred and five of the private and special laws of
3 eighteen hundred and eighty-seven is hereby
4 amended so as to read as follows:

‘Section 4. In case the judge shall be tempo-
6 rarily unable to attend said court, the recorder
7 may enter new actions returnable at said term,

8 and enter up judgment in all defaulted actions,
9 and may then, by proclamation, adjourn the court
10 to a day certain, or to the next term. In case of
11 the more permanent disability of the judge or his
12 being interested in any suit, the recorder may
13 notify any justice of the supreme judicial court,
14 who may designate a trial justice in said county,
15 who, upon being duly sworn, may hold said court
16 until such disability is removed, or try any suit in
17 which the regular judge may be interested. Said
18 judge shall hold a court on each Monday in every
19 month for cases of Forcible entry and Detainer and
20 on the first and third Monday of each month for
21 other civil business, at ten o'clock in the forenoon
22 and may adjourn from time to time, but shall be
23 considered in constant session for the trial of
24 criminal offenses.'
