STATE OF MAINE.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in Legislature assembled :

The Piscataquis Falls Pulp and Paper Company, a corporation duly established by law, and having its place of business at Enfield in the County of Penobscot, respectfully asks that authority may be given it to locate, construct and maintain in the Penobscot river, in the towns of Enfield and Howland, and not more than four miles above said company's dam, piers and booms for the purpose of collecting and holding logs and pulp wood, and conducting said logs and pulp wood to the canal and mill of said company, said piers and booms to be so constructed and located as not to interfere with the navigation of Penobscot river for logs and lumber.
