STATE OF MAINE.

AN OUTLINE PLAN containing suggestions looking to the enactment of such legislation as will secure a proper exhibition of the resources of the several States and Territories of the Federal Union at the World's Columbian Exposition in the City of Chicago, State of Illinois, 1893.

AN ACT.

- 1 To provide for the collection, arrangement, and
- 2 display of the products of the State of Maine at
- 3 the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, and
- 4 to make an appropriation therefor
- 5 Whereas, The Congress of the United States
- 6 has provided, by an act approved April 25, 1890,
- 7 for celebrating the four hundredth anniversary of

- 8 the discovery of America by Christopher Colum-
- 9 bus by holding an international exhibition of arts,
- 10 industries, manufactures, and the products of the
- 11 soil, mine, and sea, in the City of Chicago, in the
- 12 State of Illinois, in the year 1893; and
- 13 Whereas, It is of great importance that the
- 14 natural resources, industrial development, and
- 15 general progress of the State of Maine should be
- 16 fully and creditably displayed to the world at said
- 17 Exposition; therefore,
- 18 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Rep-
- 19 resentatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:
- 20 That for the purpose of exhibiting the resources,
- 21 products, and general development of the State of
- 22 Maine at the World's Columbian Exposition of
- 23 1893, a Commission is hereby constituted, to be
- 24 designated, The Board of World's Fair Managers
- 25 of Maine, which shall consist of eight residents of
- 26 the State of Maine of whom four shall be men, and
- 27 four women, to be organized and continue its
- 28 duties as hereinafter provided. One man and one
- 29 woman from each congressional district. The
- 30 men shall be chosen two each from the two lead-
- 31 ing political parties.
- 32 Section 2. The World's Columbian Commis-
- 33 sioners and the members of the Board of Lady

- 34 Managers of the World's Columbian Commission 35 from the State of Maine and their respective alter-36 nates and the World's Columbian Commissioner-37 at-Large and the member at large of the Board of 38 Lady Managers from the State of Maine, with their 39 respective alternates, if there be such representa-40 tives at large residing in said State, shall be 41 ex-officio members of the Board of World's Fair 42 Managers for the State of Maine.
- 43Section 3. The members of said Board shall 44 be appointed by the Governor within —— days 45 after the passage of this Act, and shall meet at 46 such times as the Governor may appoint, and 47 organize by the election of a President, a Vice-48 President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. 49 Treasurer of said Board shall give a bond to the 50 State in the sum of —— dollars, with —— sureties, 51 to be approved by the Governor, for the proper 52 performance of his duties. — members of said 53 Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction The Board shall have power to make 54 of business. 55 rules and regulations for its own government, 56 provided such rules and regulations shall not con-57 flict with the regulations adopted under the Act of 58 Congress for the government of said World's

- 59 Columbian Exposition. Any member of the Board
- 60 may be removed at any time by the Governor for
- 61 cause. Any vacancy which may occur in the
- 62 membership of said Board shall be filled by the
- 63 Governor.
- 64 Section 4. The members of the Board
- 65 appointed under this Act who are not officers
- 66 thereof shall not be entitled to any compensation
- 67 for their services out of the State Treasury except
- 68 their actual expenses for transportation and the
- 69 sum of dollars per day for subsistence for
- 70 each day they are necessarily absent from their
- 71 homes on the business of said Board.
- 72 Section 5. The Board of World's Fair Mana-
- 73 gers is authorized and directed to appoint an
- 74 Executive Commissioner and to fix his salary, sub-
- 75 ject to the approval of the Governor, which shall
- 76 be payable monthly out of the appropriation here-
- 77 inafter made, and said Executive Commissioner
- 78 shall be authorized and required to assume and
- 79 exercise, subject to the supervision of said Board,
- 80 all such executive powers and functions as may be
- 81 necessary to secure a complete and creditable dis-
- 82 play of the interests of the State at the World's
- 83 Columbian Exposition of 1893; and, as the Execu-
- 84 tive Agent of said Board he shall have personal

85 charge of the solicitation, collection, transportation, 86 arrangement, and exhibition of the objects sent 87 under the authority of the State to the World's 88 Columbian Exposition of 1893, and of such objects 89 sent by individual citizens of the State as may be 90 by them placed in his charge. He shall make 91 a report to the Board monthly and shall hold office 92 at the pleasure of the Board.

93 Section 6. The said Board shall have 94 charge of the interests of the State and its citi-95 zens in the preparation and exhibition, at the 96 World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, of the 97 natural and industrial products of the State, and 98 of objects illustrating its history, progress, moral 99 and material welfare and future development, and 100 in all other matters relating to the said World's 101 Columbian Exposition; it shall communicate with 102 the officers of and obtain and disseminate through 103 the State all necessary information regarding said 104 Exposition, and in general have and exercise full 105 authority in relation to the participation of the 106 State of Maine and its citizens in the World's 107 Columbian Exposition of 1893.

108 Section 7. The said Board shall make a 109 report of its proceedings and expenditures from 110 time to time to the Governor, and at any time

- 111 upon his written request, to be by him transmit-
- 112 ted to the Legislature, together with such sug-
- 113 gestions as he may deem important regarding
- 114 provision for a complete and creditable represen-
- 115 tation of the State at the World's Columbian
- 116 Exposition of 1893.
- 117 Section 8. To carry out the provisions of
- 118 this Act, the sum of —— dollars, or so much
- 119 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appro-
- 120 priated, and the State Treasurer is directed to
- 121 pay the same from the sum appropriated on the
- 122 requisition of said Board, signed by its President
- 123 and Secretary and approved by the Governor,
- 124 and accompanied by estimates of the expenses to
- 125 the payment of which the money so drawn is to
- 126 be applied.
- 127 Sect. 9. This act shall take effect on and 128 after its approval.

STATE OF MAINE.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives:

We, the undersigned, Commissioners and Alternates of the World's Columbian Commission from the State of Maine, feeling that it is of the greatest importance that Maine should be creditably represented at the World's Columbian Exposition, to be held in Chicago, in 1893, do most respectfully petition for an appropriation adequate to make such an exhibit as will be for the best interests of the State, and to be expended in accordance with the annexed bill.
