STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter Fifty-eight, Section
Two of Private and Special Laws of 1887, relating
to the Buckfield Village Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter fifty-eight of
2 private and special laws of 1887 is hereby amended
3 by striking out the words "the building, leasing
4 and maintaining of water works and" in the third
5 and fourth lines thereof, and the words "and [for
6 the building and keeping in repair side walks," so
7 that section two shall read as follows :

‘Section 2. Said corporation is hereby invested
9 with power, at any legal meeting called for the
10 purpose, to raise such sums of money as may be
11 sufficient for the purchase, repair and preservation
12 of one or more fire engines, engine houses, hose,
13 buckets, hooks, ladders or other apparatus for the
14 extinguishment of fire; and for organizing and
15 maintaining within its limits an efficient fire depart-
16 ment. Also for the support and maintenance of
17 public and free high schools, within said corpora-
18 tion, and lighting the streets; provided, however,
19 that the territory embraced within the limits of the
20 William F. Robinson farm, the Solon C. Tuttle
21 farm, the E. C. Record farm, the Silas Shaw farm,
22 the Captain Jenkins stand and the B. H. Record
23 farm, all situated east of Hall’s bridge, so called, the
24 R. B. Waite farm, the N. T. Shaw farm, the Cyrus
25 Dean farm and the Ephraim Lorne farm, together
26 with all personal property belonging on the same
27 and the occupants thereof, are hereby exempted
28 from the provisions of this act except for money
29 raised for educational purposes.’
