STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to authorize the Piscataquis Falls Pulp
and Paper Company to locate, construct, and main-
tain piers and booms in the Penobscot river.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Authority is hereby given to the
2 Piscataquis Falls Pulp and Paper Company, a
3 corporation duly established by law, and having
4 its place of business at Enfield, in the county of
5 Penobscot, to locate, construct and maintain in the
6 Penobscot river in the towns of Enfield and How-
7 land, piers and booms for the purpose of collecting

8 and holding logs and pulp wood and conducting
9 said logs and pulp wood to the canal and mill of
10 said company, said piers and booms to be between
11 said company's dam and a line drawn across the
12 river at the foot of Moon island; said piers and
13 booms to be so located and constructed as not to
14 interfere with the navigation of said river for logs
15 and lumber.

SECT. 2. Said company shall, so far as it can,
2 prevent the logs of other parties getting into any
3 of its booms, but if without fault on the part of
4 said company logs of other parties in any consid-
5 erable quantities should get into any of the booms
6 of said company, said company shall take them
7 out of such boom by the time the rear of the drive
8 in which said logs come shall reach the foot of
9 said boom, if possible, and in all other cases said
10 company shall be entitled to a reasonable time for
11 the taking of stray logs out of any of their booms
12 and delivering the same to the owners after
13 demand for such delivery shall be made upon it.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when ap-
12 proved.
