STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Limerick Academy.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars is 2 hereby annually appropriated for the term of ten 3 years, to Limerick Academy, an institution of 4 learning located in the town of Limerick in the 5 county of York; provided, however, that this 6 appropriation is made on the express conditions 7 that the trustees of said institution shall maintain 8 and keep in operation a school equal in rank and 9 grade of teaching with a first-class academy; and 10 provided further, that the governor and counci 11 and superintendent of common schools shall have 12 a right at all times to visit said school when the 13 same shall be in operation; and if, in the opinion 14 of the governor and council, said institution at any 15 time hereafter shall fail to fulfil the conditions of 16 this resolve, they may, in their discretion, withhold 17 the appropriation herein granted.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This institution was incorporated in 1808 under Massachusetts, went into operation in 1811, and has so continued most of the time since, except during rebuilding which has had to be accomplished twice on account of fires in 1851 and 1870, and mostly by subscription of citizens.

The grand work of the institution thus far has been made possible by contributions of over \$7000 from its friends; but it cannot go on for the next few years without aid from the State.
