STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to incorporate the People's Prohibitory
Enforcement League of Maine.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. John C. Stewart, Sidney T. Fuller
2 and John W. Mitchell, their associates, successors
3 and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by
4 the name of the People's Prohibitory Enforcement
5 League of Maine, for the purpose of securing, by
6 all lawful means, a thorough and effective enforce-

7 ment of the prohibitory liquor law of the State of
8 Maine, and efficiency in the law itself.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may sue and be sued;
2 plead and be impleaded; have and use a common
3 seal, and alter the same at pleasure; make for its
4 government by-laws not repugnant to the constitu-
5 tion and laws of the State; and have and enjoy all
6 appropriate and necessary powers and privileges
7 usually granted to corporations.

SECT. 3. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall not exceed the sum of \$100,000, to be divided
3 into shares of one dollar each.

SECT. 4. For its uses and purposes, said cor-
2 poration may acquire, by gift or purchase, and hold
3 with full power to dispose of, real and personal
4 estate to an amount not exceeding \$100,000.

SECT. 5. The first meeting of this corporation
2 may be called by either of the corporators, by giv-
3 ing a written notice of the time and place thereof to
4 each corporator at least seven days before the
5 meeting.
