STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to authorize the Lake Hebron Navigation
Company to navigate Lake Hebron.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. The Lake Hebron Navigation Com-
2 pany, its successors and assigns, is hereby vested
3 with the right to navigate Lake Hebron, otherwise
4 known as Hebron pond, in the town of Monson,
5 with every kind of boat propelled by steam, used in
6 carrying passengers or freight for public use for the

7 term of five years; provided that, if said company,
8 its successors and assigns, shall neglect for the
9 term of five days between the first day of June and
10 the first day of October of each of said five years,
11 to navigate said lake with a steamboat by making
12 regular daily trips on said lake, this act shall be
13 void, unless such neglect shall be caused by some
14 unavoidable accident.

Nothing in this act shall be construed as apply-
16 ing to steamboats used by private parties for pri-
17 vate purposes.

SECT. 2. Any person or corporation who shall
2 use or employ on said lake any boat or water craft
3 for public use, propelled by steam, without being
4 authorized by said company, its successors or
5 assigns, shall forfeit for each offense not less than
6 twenty nor more than fifty dollars, to be recovered
7 by and for said company, its successors and assigns,
8 in an action of debt.
