STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to ratify and confirm the organization of Public Works Company, and to give said Company additional Powers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The organization of Public Works 2 Company, a corporation organized under the gen-3 eral laws of the State of Maine, and the certificate 4 of organization of which corporation was filed in 5 the office of the Secretary of State, on the first day 6 of November, 1889, is hereby ratified and con-7 firmed.

- SECT. 2. Said corporation shall have all the 2 powers specified in its said certificate of organiza-3 tion, and may carry on and operate water works, 4 gas works, electric light and power works, lines 5 and systems, cable, electric and horse railways 6 which it may legally acquire.
- SECT. 3. Said corporation may purchase or lease 2 the property and business of the Bangor Street 3 Railway, Bangor Electric Light and Power Com-4 pany, Penobscot Water Power Company, Brewer 5 Water Company and the Bangor Gas Light 6 Company, and may issue its own stock or bonds, 7 or both, in payment therefor, and it may issue its 8 bonds secured by a mortgage or mortgages upon 9 its property and franchises to such an amount as 10 may be necessary for its purposes; and it may 11 assume and bind itself to pay outstanding obligations of such corporations as a part of the consideration for such purchase.
- SECT. 4. Said corporation may become a stock-2 holder in any of said corporations in whole or in 3 part.
- Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when ap-2 proved.
