STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Henry H. Bucklin of Thomaston.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appro-2 priated from the State treasury the sum of ninety-3 four dollars and seventeen cents, to be paid Henry 4 H. Bucklin of Thomaston, for back pay due him as 5 guard at the Maine State Prison.

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STATEMENT OF FACTS.

THOMASTON, Dec. 24, 1890.

Claim of Henry H. Bucklin, Guard of Maine State Prison, from April 30, 1883, due for that year, \$51.67; due for the year 1884, \$37.50; due for the year 1885, \$5.00; total, \$94.17.

THOMASTON, Jan. 1, 1891.

The facts of this case are these: Henry H. Bucklin became a Guard of the Maine State Prison April 30, 1883; he received four months' pay at the rate of \$420.00 a year; fifteen months at the rate of \$450.00 a year; three months at the rate of \$480.00 a year. The laws of the State fixes the salary at the time of this service at \$500.00 a year, therefore there is due said Bucklin \$94.17.
