## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-ONE.

---

AN ACT to amend section 7 of chapter 4 of the Revised  
Statutes, relating to Lists of Voters.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section seven of chapter four of the Revised  
2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words  
3 "one thousand" in the first line and inserting in place  
4 thereof the words 'five hundred,' so that said section as  
5 amended shall read as follows :

'Section 7. In all towns, cities not included, having five  
7 hundred or more registered voters, the municipal officers  
8 shall receive applications of persons claiming a right to  
9 vote, on the three secular days next preceding the day of

10 election, and no application shall be received after the  
11 hour of five in the afternoon on the secular day next pre-  
12 ceding the day of election ; and no names shall be added  
13 to the list of voters on the day of election, by certificate  
14 or otherwise, except such as were upon the list of the  
15 previous year, and have been inadvertently omitted by the  
16 selectmen ; and on that day no change shall be made in  
17 names except to correct clerical errors therein.'
