STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 451 of the private and special laws of 1885, entitled "An Act for the protection of trout and land-locked salmon in the Rangeley, South Bog, Bemis, Cupsuptic and Kennebago streams."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section one of chapter four hundred and fifty one of the 2 private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-3 five is hereby amended by striking out after the word 4 "lake" in the eleventh line the words "above the blue 5 water, so called at the mouth of said stream" and insert-6 ing therefor the words 'above the north line of Letter D

7 Plantation in Franklin county on said stream,' so that 8 said section as amended shall read as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill, fish for or 10 destroy any trout or land-locked salmon in the Rangeley 11 stream between the mouth of the Kennebago stream and 12 the head of the island at the eddy, so called, in said 13 Rangeley stream from the first day of July to the first 14 day of May, nor in that portion of said stream from the 15 head of said island to the Rangeley dam, at any time; 16 nor in the South Bog stream which empties into Rangeley 17 lake, above the dead water at the mouth of said stream, 18 from the first day of July to the first day of May; nor in 19 the Bemis stream which empties into Mooselucmaguntic 20 lake above the north line of Letter D Plantation in 21 Franklin county on said stream, from the first day of July 22 to the first day of May; nor in the Cupsuptic stream 23 which empties into the Cupsuptic lake, between the foot 24 of the first falls towards its mouth and its source, from 25 the first day of July to the first day of May; nor in the 26 Kennebago stream between the foot of the first falls 27 towards its mouth and the upper falls at the outlet of 28 Kennebago lake, from the first day of September to the 29 first day of May.'
