## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-ONE.

---

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and six of  
the Revised Statutes, relating to the Selection and  
Service of Jurors.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section three of chapter one hundred and six of  
2 the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by insert-  
3 ing after the word "constables" the following  
4 words: 'All persons engaged in the unlawful  
5 traffic in intoxicating liquors or who are known to  
6 be habitually addicted to the use of intoxicating

7 liquors as a beverage,' so that said section shall  
8 read as follows:

‘Section 3. The following persons are exempt  
10 from serving as jurors, and their names shall not  
11 be placed on the lists: The governor, councilors,  
12 judges and clerks of common law courts, secretary  
13 and treasurer of the State, all officers of the United  
14 States, judges and registers of probate, registers  
15 of deeds, settled ministers of the gospel, officers of  
16 colleges, preceptors of incorporated academies,  
17 physicians and surgeons, cashiers of incorporated  
18 banks, sheriffs and their deputies, coroners, coun-  
19 selors and attorneys at law, county commissioners,  
20 constables, all persons engaged in the unlawful  
21 traffic in intoxicating liquors or who are known to  
22 be habitually addicted to the use of intoxicating  
23 liquors as a beverage and constant ferrymen.’
