STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to authorize Charles G. Perry, Arthur C. Perry,
and E. Sumner Perry to erect and maintain piers and
booms in the Aroostook river.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Charles G. Perry, Arthur C. Perry, and E.
2 Sumner Perry, their associates, successors, heirs and
3 assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to locate,
4 build and maintain in that part of the Aroostook river, in
5 the town of Caribou, in the county of Aroostook, that is
6 described in section two of this act, all necessary piers
7 and booms for the purpose of sorting and holding all logs
8 and lumber driven down said river, or otherwise procured,
9 which are destined or intended for use or manufacture at

10 any mill, or mills, on said river, owned, controlled, man-
11 aged, or operated by said Perrys, their associates, suc-
12 cessors, heirs and assigns.

SECT. 2. Said piers and booms may be located, built
2 and maintained in any part of said river which is within
3 the bounds and limits named and described, and hereby
4 established, as follows: Commencing on the easterly bank
5 of said river, at the north line of that part of lot num-
6 bered forty-five now owned by said Perrys in that part of
7 said Caribou formerly H Township, thence west into said
8 river a distance of one hundred and ninety feet; thence
9 southerly up said river following the line of the piers in
10 said river as now built by said Perrys, to pier number
11 ten; thence southerly up said river at a uniform distance
12 of two hundred feet from the east bank of said river to a
13 point opposite the mouth of the Irving brook so called;
14 thence to the east bank of said river; thence northerly
15 and along the east bank of said river to the place of
16 beginning. But said piers and booms shall not be located,
17 built or maintained so as to in any way interfere with a
18 reasonable and suitable passage along the westerly side of
19 said river, for all logs, lumber, rafts, and boats.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
