STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Education of the Youth
in the township of Parlin Pond, Somerset county.

Resolved, That the interest on the money now
2 deposited in the state treasury belonging to the
3 township of Parlin Pond for school purposes, and
4 such part of the principal as the state superin-
5 tendent of common schools shall deem right and
6 proper, shall be annually appropriated for the edu-
7 cation of the youth in said township, but the same
8 shall be expended under the direction of the said
9 superintendent.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The township of Parlin pond is unorganized and as it is mostly covered with mountains and consists of land not susceptible to cultivation, it can never in all probability become an organized plantation.

The state road which runs from Skowhegan through said township to Canada and has been traveled more than one hundred years; passes through this plantation, notwithstanding this fact there are but two houses in said township and at the present time one family, that of N. W. Murphy, who has three children.

Said township has about seven hundred dollars in the state treasury to be used for school purposes, but under the general law, that cannot be so used until said township is organized, and as there will never in all probability be inhabitants enough to organize, said money is doing no one any good. The purpose of the above resolve is to give said children the benefit of the income of said money.
