STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend Section 8, Chapter 115, of the Revised Statutes, relating to compensation of Members of the Government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 115 of the Re-2 vised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out 3 the words "one hundred and fifty" in the eleventh 4 line, and inserting the words "two hundred,' so that 5 the second clause of said section shall read as fol-6 lows:

SENATE-No. 224.

'Each member of the senate and house of repre-8 sentatives shall receive two hundred dollars for the 9 regular session of the legislature, and two dollars 10 for every ten miles' travel from his place of abode 11 once in each session. He is entitled to mileage on 12 the first day of the session, and fifty dollars of his 13 salary on the first day of each month thereafter 14 during the session, and the balance at the end 15 thereof; but two dollars shall be deducted from 16 the pay of every member for each day that he is 17 absent from his duties without being excused by 18 the house to which he belongs. The president of the 19 senate and speaker of the house of representatives 20 shall receive three hundred dollars for each ses-21 sion, with the same mileage as other members, and 22 subject to the same deduction in case of absence. 23 Any member acting as president pro tempore of 24 the senate, or speaker pro tempore of the house, 25 shall receive two dollars a day extra therefor.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

The Committee on Judiciary, to whom was referred the bill, entitled "An act to amend chapter 115, Revised Statutes, relating to compensation of members of the government, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report that the same ought not to pass.
