STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to apportion one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the State of Maine.

Resolved, That for the sixty-sixth legislature and the succeed-2 ing legislatures, to and including that of the year two thousand 3 and one:

The county of Androscoggin shall choose eleven representatives to be apportioned as follows, to wit:

Lewiston, 4; Auburn, 2; Lisbon, 1; Turner and Livermore, 1; East Livermore, Leeds and Greene, 1; Poland and Durham, 1; Minot, Webster and Wales, 1.

The county of Aroostook shall choose twelve representatives to be apportioned as follows:

New Limerick, Ludlow, Hammond, Littleton, C. R. 2, Monticello, Bridgewater, D. R. 2, 1; Blaine, Mars Hill, Westfield, E. R. 2; 9, R. 5; Oxbow, Masardis, Garfield, Ashland, Chapman, Mapleton, Castle Hill, 9, R. 3, 9, R. 4, 9, R. 6, 9, R. 7, 10, R. 3, 10,

Frenchville, 17, R. 5 and 17, R. 4, 1; Fort Kent, New Canada, Wallagrass, Eagle Lake, Winterville, 14, R.7, 14, R.6, Portage Lake, Nashville, Sheridan, St. John, St. Francis, Allagash, 18, R. 10, 15, R. 11, 16, R. 12, 12, R. 13, 14, R. 14, 13, R. 15, 14, R. 16 and all other unorganized townships not included in any other class district, 1; Reed, Bancroft, Weston, Haynesville, Glenwood, 3, R. 4, 4, R. 3, Orient, Amity, 3, R. 2, Cary, A, R. 2; Hodgdon, Linneus, 1; Houlton, 1; Molunkus, Macwahoc, 1, R. 4, 1, R. 5; Silver Ridge, Benedicta, Sherman, Crystal, Island Falls, Hersey, Dyer Brook, Oakfield, Moro, Merrill, Smyrna, 7, R 5, 8, R. 5, 2, R. 4, 3, R. 4, 7. R. 3, 8, R. 3, 7. R. 4 and 8, R. 4, 1.

The county of Cumberland shall choose twenty-one representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Portland, 6; Cape Elizabeth, 1; Westbrook, 1; Deering, 1; Brunswick, 1; Gorham, 1; Bridgton, 1; Windham and Pownal, 1; Freeport, 1; Casco, Otisfield and Harrison, 1; Baldwin and Standish, 1; Gray and New Gloucester, 1; Falmouth and Cumberland, 1; Sebago, Naples and Raymond, 1; Yarmouth and North Yarmouth, 1; Scarborough, for the years 1893, 1897 and 1901, Harpswell, for the years 1895 and 1899, 1. Scarborough shall choose one in the years 1894 and 1898 if by reason of an amendment of the Constitution annual and regular sessions of the legislature shall be held in those years. Harpswell shall choose one in the years 1896 and 1900 if, for the same reason such session shall be held in those years.

The county of Franklin shall choose four representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Farmington and New Sharon, 1; Wilton, Jay, Carthage and Chesterville, 1; Avon, Strong, Phillips*, Salem, Weld, Temple,

Perkins plantation, Washington plantation, Number Six plantation, and Letter E plantation, 1; Knightville, Rangeley, New Vineyard, Freeman's, Eustis, Madrid, Industry, Rangeley plantation, Greenvale plantation, Coplin plantation, Dallas and all other territory in the county of Franklin not included in any other district, 1. The town of Phillips is authorized to elect a representative for the years 1893, 1894, 1901 and 1902.

The county of Hancock shall choose nine representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Ellsworth, 1; Bucksport and Verona, 1; Orlando, Castine and Brooksville, 1; Bluehill, Surry and Dedham, 1; Mount Desert, Eden, Tremont and Cranberry Isle, 1; Deer Isle, Swan's Island and all other islands in said county not included in any other district, 1; Gouldsboro', Sullivan, Franklin, Eastbrook and townships and plantations, numbers 7, 8, 9, 10 and 21, 1; Trenton, Lamoine, Hancock, Waltham, Mariaville, Otis, Amherst, Aurora, Plantation Number 33, and all other plantations and townships not included in any other district, 1; Penobscot, Sedgwick, Brooklin and Long Island, 1.

The county of Kennebec shall choose thirteen representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Augusta, 2; Clinton, Winslow and Benton, 1; Belgrade, Rome and Winthrop, 1; Mt. Vernon, Vienna, Readfield and Fayette, 1; Waterville, 1; Vassalborough and Windsor, 1; Randolph, Pittston, Farmingdale and West Gardiner, 1; Gardiner, 1; Manchester, Oakland and Sidney, 1; China, Albion, Chelsea and Unity plantation, 1; Wayne, Monmouth and Litchfield, 1; Hallowell, 1.

The county of Knox shall choose eight representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Washington, Applet on and Hope, 1; Rockland, 2; South Thomaston, Vinalhaven, North Haven and Hurricane Isle, 1; Union and Warren, 1; Camden, 1895 and 1899; Rockport, 1893 and 1897, 1; St. George, Cushing and Friendship, 1; Thomaston, Pl. of Matinicus Isle and Muscle Ridge, 1.

The county of Lincoln shall choose five representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Boothbay Harbor, Southport, Westport and Wiscasset, 1; Dresden, Whitefield, Jefferson and Bremen, 1; Boothbay, Alna, Newcastle and Nobleboro, 1; Waldoboro and Edgecomb, 1; Bristol, Damariscotta, Somerville and Monhegan, 1.

The county of Oxford shall choose six representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Porter, Brownfield, Fryeburg, Hiram and Lovell, 1; Stow, Denmark, Stoneham, Sweden, Waterford, Albany, Woodstock, Mason, Gilead and Fryeburg Academy and Batchelder's Academy grants and Woodstock, 1; Bethel, Hanover, Newry, Grafton, Upton, Riley, Lincoln, Magalloway and Tp's North, Andover and North and West Surplus. Rumford and all territory not otherwise included, 1; Mexico, Roxbury, Byron, Dixfield, Peru and Franklin plantation, Milton plantation, Canton and Sumner, 1; Norway, Oxford, Hebron and Greecwood, 1; Paris, Buckfield and Hartford, 1.

The county of Penobscot shall choose seventeen representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Chase, Patten, Staceyville plantation, Medway, Woodville plantation, Mattawamkeag, Chester, and all other territory not specifically classed, 1; Kingman, Prentiss, Winn, Springfield, Carroll, Drew plantation, Webster plantation, and Lakeville plantation, 1; Lincoln, Lee, Burlington, Lowell, Grand Falls plantation, No. 1 plantation, and No. 3, Range 1, east of Burlington, 1. The town of Lincoln is authorized to elect a representative for the years 1893, '94 and 1895 and '96 Passadumkeag, Mattamiscontis, Maxfield, Enfield, Howland, Edinburg, Lagrange, Argyle, Alton, Greenbush, Sebois plantation, Milford, Greenfield, Eddington, Holden, Clifton, Veazie, 1; Orono, Bradley, 1; Orrington, Hampden, 1; Bradford, Hudson, 1; Charleston, Corinth, Kenduskeag, 1; Carmel, Glenburn, Hermon, Levant, 1; Dixmont, Newburg, Plymouth, Etna, Stetson, 1; Newport, Corinna, Exeter, 1; Dexter, Garland, 1.

The county of Piscataquis shall choose four representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Wellington, Kinsbury plantation, Blanchard, Shirley, Monson, Greenville, Squaw Mountain, Gore A, No. 2, Day's Academy Grant, Township A, R. 14, W. E. L. S., Township 1, R. 13, W. E. L. S., East Middlesex Grant, Township 3, (E. K.) East Kennebec, A, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, R. 13, W. E. L. S., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, R. 14, W. E. L. S., X, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, R. 15, W. E. L. S., including Grant Farm, Chesuncook and N. E. Carry, Williamantic, Elliotsville plantation, 1; Parkman, Sangerville, Dover, 1; Sebec, Barnard plantation, Bowerbank plantation, Foxcroft, Guilford, Abbot, 1; Brownville, Katahdin Iron Works plantation, Williamsburg, Township 5, R. 9, N. W. P., East College, township, West College, township, Atkinson, Orneville, Medford, Milo, Township 4, R. 9, 1.

The county of Sagadahoc shall choose four representatives to be apportioned as follows:

The county of Somerset shall choose seven representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Skowhegan, 1; Fairfield, Smithfield and Mercer, 1; Norridgewock, Starks, Anson and New Portland, 1; Madison, Solon, Athens and Cornville, 1; Pittsfield, Canaan and Hartland, 1; Palmyra, St. Albans, Ripley, Cambridge, Harmony and Detroit, 1; Bingham, Embden, Brighton, Concord, Moscow and all plantations.

The county of Waldo shall choose six representatives to be apportioned as follows:

The county of Washington shall choose ten representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Cherryfield, Steuben, Millbridge, Deblois, Reddington, Devereux, 1; Harrington, Columbia Falls, Columbia, Addison, 1; Machias, Jonesboro', Roque Bluffs, Centerville, Whitneyville, Northfield, Wesley, 1; East Machias, Marshfield Townships Number 14, 18, 19, Crawford, Marion, Whiting, Dennysville, Edmunds, 1; Pembroke, Charlotte, Meddybemps, Cooper, Alexander, Robbinston, 1; Lubec, Perry, Trescott, 1; Jonesport, Machiasport, Cutler, 1; Eastport, 1; Calais, 1; Princeton, Danforth, Vanceboro', Baileyville, Baring, Topsfield, Brookton, Waite, Forrest City, Kossuth, Codyville, Grand Lake, Talmadge, Lambert Lake, Township Number 21, 1.

The county of York shall choose fourteen representatives to be apportioned as follows:

Biddeford, 2; Saco, 1; Sanford, 1; Parsonsfield, Cornish and Newfield, 1; Waterboro', Shapleigh and Limerick, 1; Alfred, Lyman and Limington, 1; North Berwick, Lebanon and Acton, 1; Buxton and Hollis, 1; Kennebunk and Dayton, 1; South Berwick and Old Orchard, 1; Berwick and Wells, 1; Kennebunkport and York, 1; Kittery and Elliot, 1, Kittery to be represented for the years 1893, 1897 and 1901, Elliot to be represented for the years 1895 and 1899, said towns to vote together for each representative.
