RESOLVE in aid of the Temporary Home for Women and  
Children.

---

*Resolved,* That the sum of two thousand dollars be and  
2 hereby is appropriated for the use of the Temporary Home  
3 for women and children at Deering, of which one thousand  
4 dollars shall be paid during the year eighteen hundred and  
5 ninety-two and one thousand dollars during the year  
6 eighteen hundred and ninety-three.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Temporary Home for Women and Children was incorporated as a State Institution April, 1882.

Its object is to provide a home for needy women and little children who are not eligible to any other existing institution.

It has been most successful in its work, as the results abundantly show. Every county in the State has been represented by those who have been cared for in this Home. It is supported largely by private subscription and donations.

For six years it has received State aid. The appropriation in 1891 was \$2,000—\$1,000 a year—which amount is again asked for in order that the beneficent work may be carried on in a way to meet the needs of the class it seeks to help.
