STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to regulate the Packing and Sale of Domestic
Sardines.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. Whoever preserves, packs or cans any herring
2 or other fish for sardines, without heading and eviscerating
3 the same, and whoever sells, offers for sale or has in his
4 possession for sale, any sardines packed without being so
5 headed and eviscerated, shall forfeit twenty dollars for
6 every one hundred cans so packed, sold, offered for sale,
7 or in possession for sale, to be recovered by indictment or

8 action of debt, one-half to the complainant, or prosecutor,
9 and one-half to the town in which the offence is committed.

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to any sardines
2 already packed.
