STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 234 of the Public Laws of 1889, relating to Fraternal Beneficiary Organizations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 3 of chapter 234 of the Public 2 Laws of 1889 is hereby amended so as to read as fol-3 lows:

Section 3. Any corporation duly organized as aforesaid,
5 and which does not employ paid agents in soliciting or
6 procuring business, other than in the preliminary organi7 zation of local branches, and which conducts its business
8 as a fraternal society on the lodge system, or limits its
9 certificate holders to a particular order, class or frater10 nity, or to the employes of a particular town or city,
11 designated firm, business house or corporation, may pro-

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12 vide in its by-laws for the payment, from time to time, 13 of a fixed sum by each member, and from this income 14 may make weekly or other payments to any member dur-15 ing a period of disability of such member. Such corporation may also provide in its by-laws for the payment, 16 17 from time to time, of a fixed sum by each member, to be paid to the beneficiaries of deceased members, in such 18 amount and manner as shall be fixed by said by-laws and 19 20 written in the benefit certificates issued to such members. 21 and payable to the husband, wife, children, relatives $\mathbf{22}$ of, or persons dependent upon such member, or $\mathbf{23}$ payable to the assured in whole or in part upon his or 24 her total disability or in yearly installments upon reach-25ing the age of seventy years : but no contract under this 26 act shall be valid or legal which shall be conditional upon an agreement or understanding that the beneficiary shall $\mathbf{27}$ 28 pay the dues and assessments, or either of them, for said 29 And such corporation now organized under the member. 30 laws of this state, which limits its certificate holders to a 31 particular order, class or fraternity, may employ paid 32agents in soliciting business. But no person shall act as 33 such an agent until he has first been licensed therefor by 34 the insurance commissioner in accordance with the pro-35 visions of section seventy-three, chapter forty-nine of the 36 Revised Statutes, and any persons violating this pro-37 vision shall, upon conviction, be punished as provided in 38 said section seventy-three. For such license the com-39 missioner shall receive one dollar.
